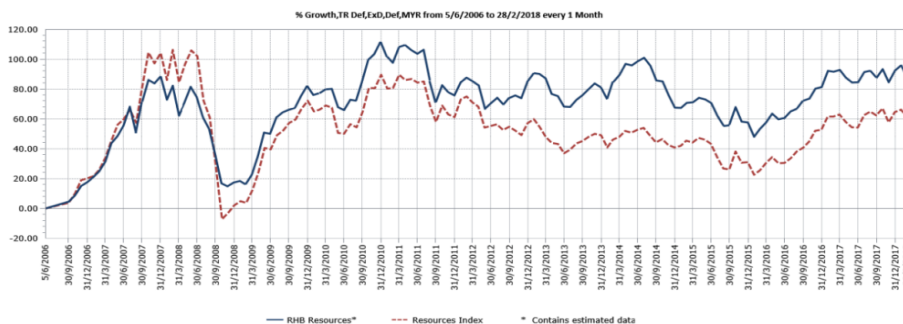
- wish to capitalise on the opportunities offered by the natural resources sectors;

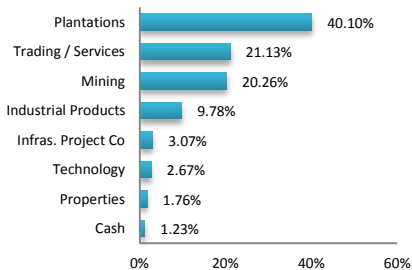

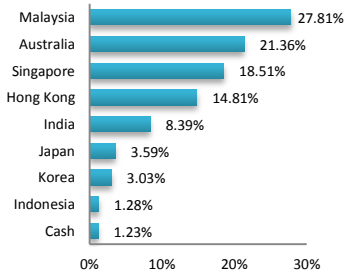

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MANAGER'S COMMENTS

MARKET REVIEW

In February, oil price declined 4.7% ending the month at US\$61 per barrel, gold also declined 2.0% but palm oil price rallied 3.3%. In February, MSCI AC Asia Index and MSCI AC South East Asia Index returned -3.0% and -1.0% respectively. The best performing indices were MSCI Thailand Index and MSCI Indonesia Index with returns of 2.5% and -2.7% respectively. MSCI China Index and MSCI Korea index were among the worst performing indices with returns of -5.9% and -5.8% respectively.

China's manufacturing PMI was slightly below expectations at 50.3 vs. consensus of 51.1. This is the third consecutive monthly decline and was mainly driven by fall in production and new orders. Japan's annualized 4Q17 GDP was lower at 0.5% QoQ vs. expectations of 1% QoQ. Taiwan's 4Q17 GDP was slightly below expectations at 3.28% YoY vs. 3.3% YoY. Malaysia's 4Q17 GDP grew at 5.9% YoY with private investment doubling and public consumption boosted from higher oil prices. Thailand 4Q17 GDP fell 4% YoY from 4.3% YoY in 3Q17 with weakness coming from the agricultural sector. Thailand reported lower inflation from raw food prices and inadvertently impacts farm income which will likely see a continued weak rural consumption. Australia 4Q17 GDP was weaker than expected, 0.4% QoQ but RBA continues to be sanguine citing robust business conditions, good employment and non-mining investment growth, strong infrastructure spending and the revival of mining investment.

MARKET OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

US real GDP grew 2.6% QoQ in the 4Q 2017 and missed expectations of 3.0%. The GDP miss was due to strength in goods imports and inventory accumulation. Core inflation surged higher in January at 1.8% YoY, higher than consensus expectations of 1.7% YoY. The pick-up in inflation was attributed to core good prices and used auto prices. President Trump signed a budget bill which ended an hours-long shutdown in the government.

The Fund is positioned into high quality stocks within the commodity markets.
