This Fund is suitable for Investors who:

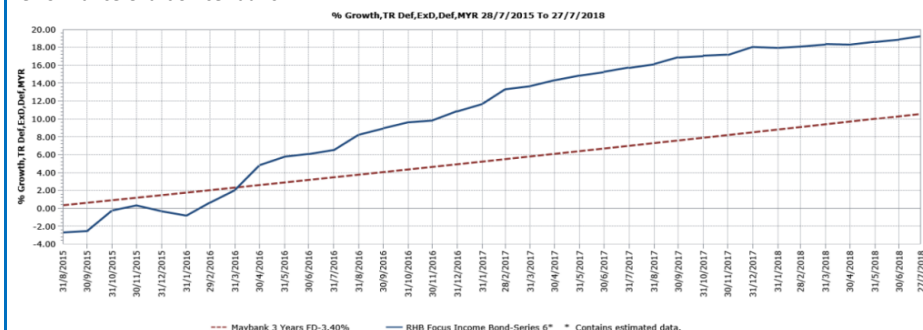
- have a moderate risk appetite;

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**MANAGER'S COMMENTS****MARKET REVIEW**

US Treasury (“UST”) 10-year yields started the month of July 2018 at 2.87%, roughly the same level from a month ago, but continued to rally over the month as escalating US-China Tit-for-tat Tariffs dominate headlines. On July 13th, the Fed released a report ahead of semi-annual testimony to Congress by Powell for July 17-18, reflecting US economic activity expanded at a solid pace in the first half of the year, gradual rate rises will be “consistent with a sustained expansion”, financial system remains “resilient” with treasury markets broadly stable and inflation is “on track” to rise to the Fed’s goal, with core Personal Consumption Expenditure (“PCE”) hitting 2% for the 12 months through May. At the end of July 2018 close, the benchmark 2-, 5-, 10- and 30-year UST were last traded at 2.67% (June-2018: 2.53% +14bps), 2.85% (2.74%; +11bps), 2.96% (2.87%; +9bps) and 3.08% (2.99%; +9bps) respectively. The US Treasury bond yield curve had been flattened slightly from June as the short end rates continues the march higher due to the rate hike expectations.

In terms of significant economic data release, the Institute of Supply Management (“ISM”) Manufacturing Index for June 2018 printed a strong 60.2, up 2.5% from May. Nonfarm Payrolls (“NFP”) in the United States released for June 2018 showed the economy added 213,000 new jobs beating the 195,000 consensus estimate. Average Hourly Earnings edged up 2.7% YoY, slightly lower than with consensus estimates of 2.8%. On inflation, the United States Personal Consumption Expenditure (“PCE”), the Fed’s preferred measure of inflation, was revised at the end of the month to 2.0% QoQ for the 2nd Quarter of 2018 and QoQ Annualised GDP was 4.1% for the 2nd Quarter 2018. Unemployment Rate was 4.0%YoY for June 2018 (Previous month was 3.8%). U.S. trade deficit fell to an eight-month low in May of \$43.1bio which further strengthened views that the Federal Reserve would raise short-term interest rates at least twice more this year.
