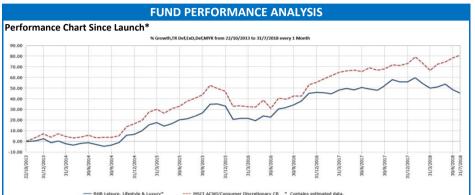

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

MARKET REVIEW

After a flattish equity return in June, the month of July saw MSCI World recovered with a positive gain of 2.9%. ASEAN (+4.0% USD terms), US (+3.5%), Europe (+3.2%) have closed the month in green and Japan (+0.4%) was flattish. HK/China (-3.1%) and Korea (-1.5%) got hurt by the looming trade war sentiment. Export oriented countries like HK, Singapore, South Korea, and Taiwan would be the hardest hit in Asia should a full-scale trade war break out. The Dollar Index (DXY) was relatively range bounded around 94.5

On 1st August, Trump administration reported plans to announce more aggressive retaliation against China and has directed US trade representative to consider increasing the proposed level of the additional duty from 10% to 25% tariff on the US\$200bn Chinese products announced on 10th July. The news pushed Shanghai Composite down 2% on the 2nd August. Though more insulated from macro volatility, Asian consumer companies also took the heat this month.

Our position in one of the Korean consumer stock performed well for us this month. After a decent set of 2Q earnings, the company guided positive sales trend of its new products launches. Also, lending strength from the ASEAN market rebound, our position in one of the low cost domestic airline recovered from an oversold position.

However, the overweight position in Facebook detracted from fund's performance in July. Share price of Facebook corrected after it reported slowing growth in users and guided to weaker revenue growth and increase spending on security and privacy enhancement. This resulted in investors selling its shares on concerns of declining active user base on privacy concerns and structurally higher investment costs. We have since rotated into Amazon and beef up our weights in US consumer companies in light good earnings performance in that sector. Reading off its recent results, Amazon has been able to capitalize on its network and display efficiencies in its core business. We believe Amazon is well positioned as the market leader in eCommerce and gains market share in growing online market.

MARKET OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

US consumption has been fundamentally supported by continued improvement in the labour market. Trend in job growth remains strong as unemployment rate has eased to 3.9% in July, a sharp improvement from an annual of 4.4% in 2017. The strong job market has also supported a gradual uptick in wages. The US hourly wage growth has been trending up to registered growth of 2.7% yoy in July, up from an average of 2.3% in 2017. While overall participation rate may seem to hold steady at 62.9% in July, a breakdown of the participation rate by age group suggested the cyclical portion of the labour market has been trending up. Indeed, participation rate for the working age population (age 25-54) has been trending up to 82% in July (from 81.6% in 2017).

Fundamental supports for housing remain sound, particularly rising household formation. Other supportive factors include solid income growth, plentiful jobs, reasonable healthy household balance sheets. As such, we are gradually shifting our weights into US post the 2Q result season.

We added a gaming stock in Australia into our portfolio. After detailed bottom up analysis, we expect the company to start a new product cycle and is likely to be in the mid —stages of gaining market share through rapidly growing installed base of games. Its raffle-linked games are popular with casinos, especially with US casinos. New growth driver will be digital games, which will position the company to take advantage in growth in digital gambling.
