

### RHB ASIA HIGH INCOME BOND FUND - RM HEDGED CLASS

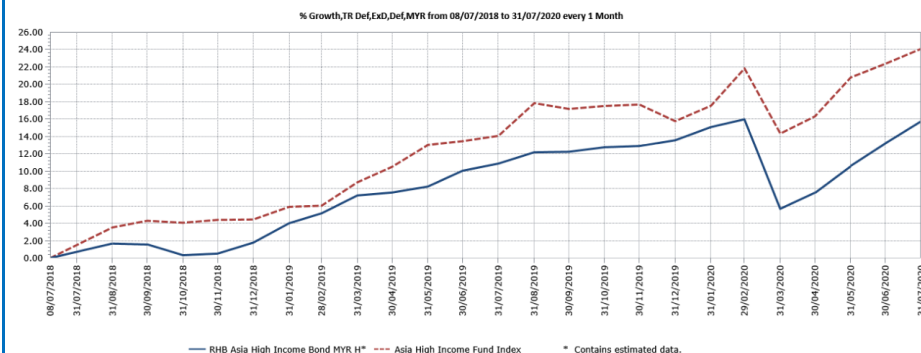

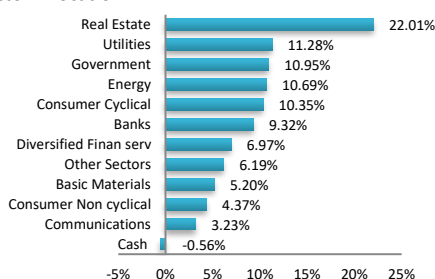

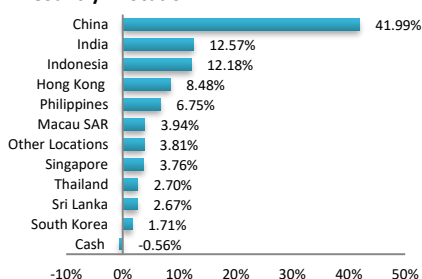

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**MANAGER'S COMMENTS**
**PORTFOLIO STRATEGY**

The Target Fund returned positively for July amid broadly lower US treasury yields and tighter spreads. On a relative basis, the fund benefitted from its selection in the China high yield industrials, Hong Kong investment grade and India high yield corporate sectors. Its overweight in Indonesia quasi sovereign bonds also added value. Conversely, the fund's selection in the Sri Lanka sovereign sector detracted. Its underweight in sovereign bonds, particularly those from Philippines and Indonesia, also took a toll on relative returns. In terms of overall portfolio allocation, the Target Fund Manager continues to overweight the Chinese property sector, although more on an individual bond selection basis. The Target Fund Manager expects to see greater divergence in credit quality within the sector against the current uncertain macro backdrop. The Target Fund Manager is also overweight the utilities sector, particularly names from China and India given their defensive nature and solid fundamentals. On the other hand, the Target Fund Manager remains underweight markets such as Korea, Hong Kong and Singapore, where they find valuations unattractive. Similarly, the Target Fund Manager is also underweight sovereign and quasi sovereign bonds. The Target Fund Manager retains their overweight duration exposure and will continue to actively manage the fund's duration exposure in the current volatile market environment.
