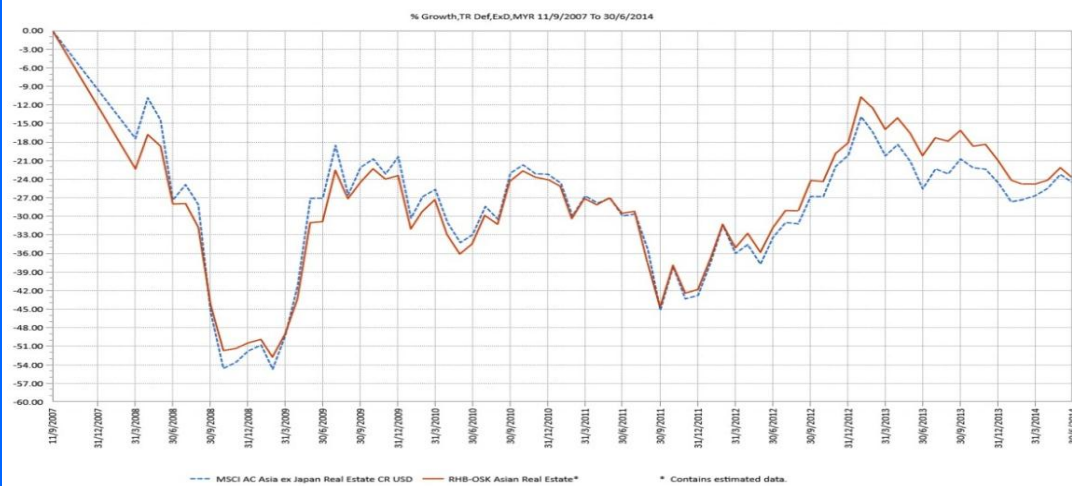

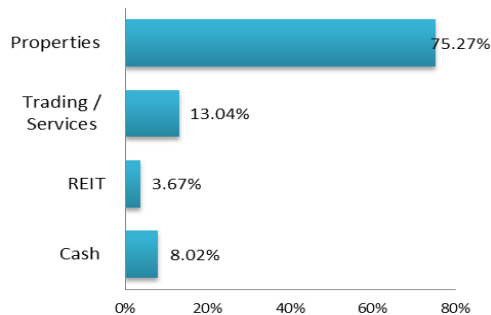

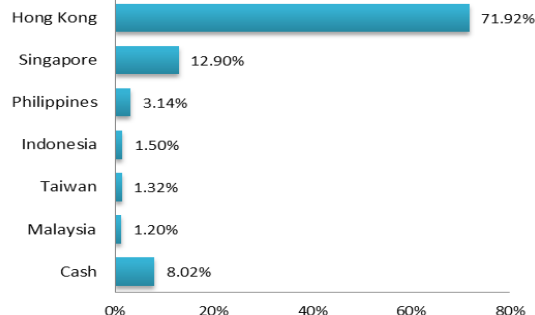

MANAGER'S COMMENTS**MARKET REVIEW**

Our fund's benchmark MSCI AC Asia ex Japan Real Estate Index (in MYR) declined by 1.9% in June. China and Taiwan property names underperformed other countries during the period. Property transactions in China picked up strongly MoM from a low base in May but failed to cheer up investment sentiments toward listed China developers. Indonesia property names also performed rather poorly before election. On the other hand, HK property developers, in general, outperformed due to gradual recovery of HK property market. During the month, appreciation of Malaysian Ringgit has negative impact on our benchmark performance as the index was down 1.7% in term of US dollar.

In China, national property transaction volumes improved both YoY and MoM across majority of cities. However, market is worrying about profitability of those transactions as developers are cutting price to stimulate transactions. In policy side, some local governments, including Hothot and Shenyang, started to relax their home purchase restrictions officially. Central government, unlike what it reacted previously, remained mute on those relaxations. We expect to see more cities to follow suit as land auction remained the main source of their financial income.

We see obvious improvements in HK property market in June. With attractive pricing, primary market was doing well in June with good sell-through in most of the newly launched property. Key reason behind this improvement is pent-up demand, which accumulated since 2H13 after introduction of tightening measures. The pent-up demand also drove up property price in second hand market, as effective supply is rather limited due to tax measures. Having said that, we remained cautious in medium terms outlook, as supply in both primary and secondary markets will be gradually increased to absorb the pent-up demand.

Singapore government announced its 2H14 land sales program in June. According to the program, 23 land slots will be released and it is estimated that 10,220 new homes can be accommodated. In fact, Singapore government is effectively reducing land supply as there were 11,585 new homes from land sales in 1H14. We think Singapore government will continue to reduce land supply to tackle with risk of hard landing in its property market.
