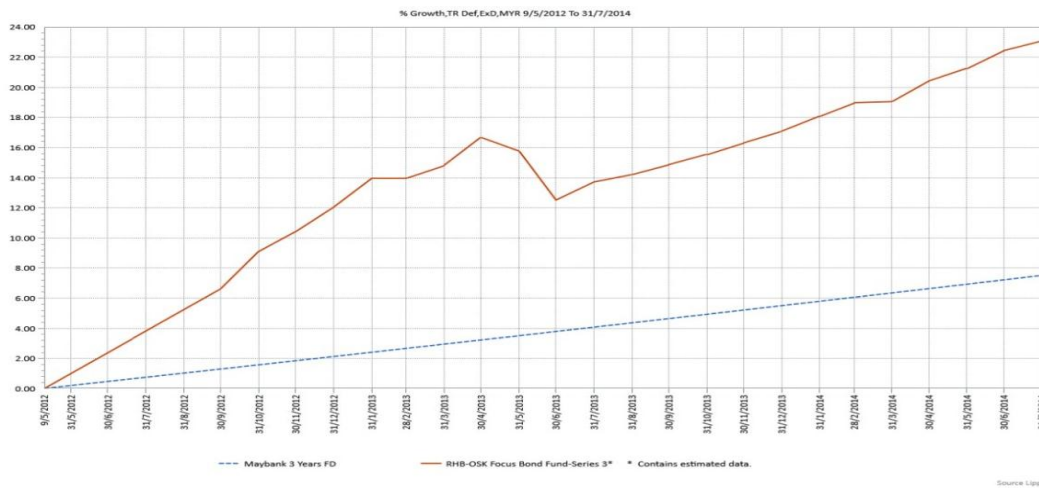
The Fund aims to maximise returns at its maturity date from a concentrated portfolio of global debt instruments.

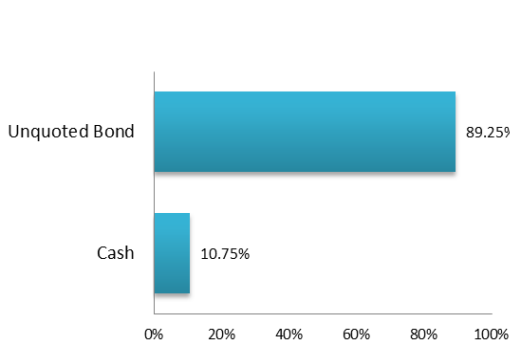
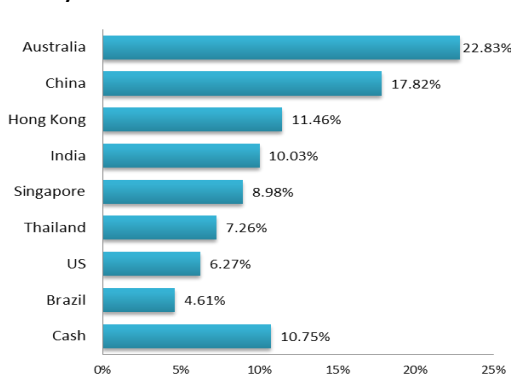

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MANAGER'S COMMENTS

MARKET REVIEW

10-year US Treasury started the month at 2.53% glided gradually lower to low of 2.45% by mid-month amidst political tensions in Eastern Europe and the Middle East. However, 10-year US Treasury gapped up on stronger than expected 4% annualized 2Q14 US GDP growth that reignited fear of possible Fed rate hike faster than market expectation. 10-year US Treasury closed the month higher at 2.56%

Investors were also generally guarded on news of Argentina sovereign second default in 13 years as well as renewed concern of European banking sector after Portugal largest listed bank, Banco Espirito Santo, reported huge losses in its 2Q14 results. On the other hand, China credits were well supported after Chinese PMI increased for five months consecutively to 51.7 in July, the highest since April 2012.

Overall conditions for credit may stay supported given low volatility, low rates, low growth and expectations of Euro & Japan QE. Stepping into August, the supply pipeline is expected to build up after the earnings season end and as investors returning from their summer vacations. However, valuations look stretched from historical range and leave little room for disappointments. We remain selective on credit risk.

STRATEGY

We will continue to be defensive and stay nimble in light of market volatility while overweighting on good quality high grade credits. The RHB-OSK Focus bond funds will await opportunistically for entry points as well as participate in primary issues with attractive pricing to deploy cash selectively while taking profit on existing holdings.
