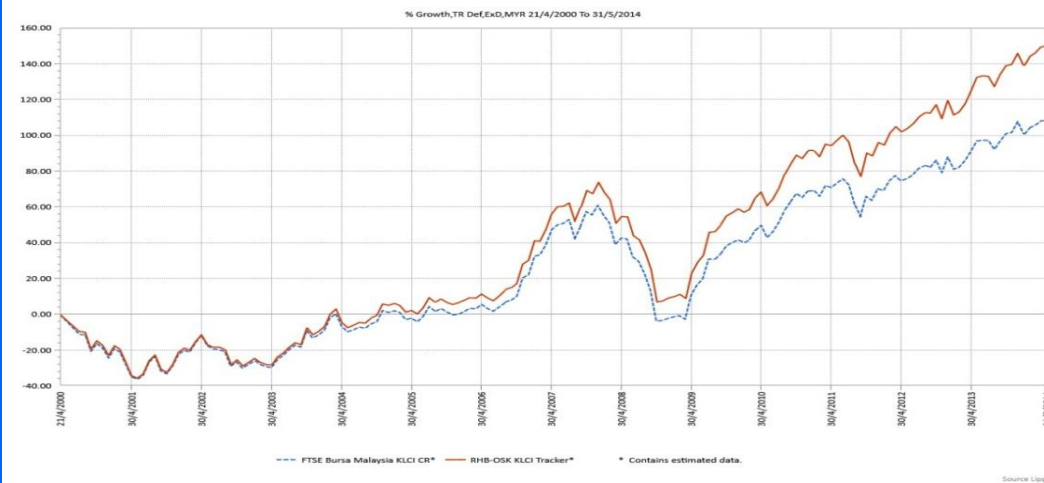
- seek equity market returns as measured by the benchmark FBM KLCI;

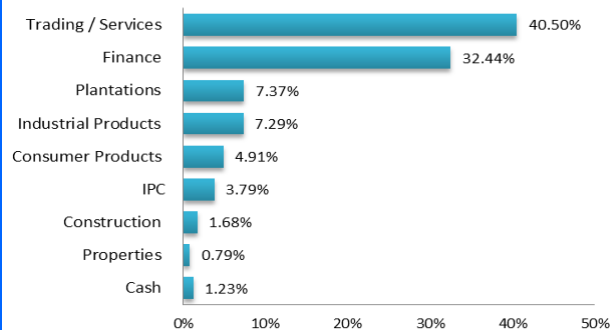

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**MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

**MARKET REVIEW**

The FBM KLCI, in May 2014, rose by 0.10% to close at 1,873 points. The broader market increased with the FBM EMAS appreciating 0.04% to 12,946 while the FBM Small Cap rose by 0.15% to 17,452 points.

**FUND REVIEW**

Tracker Fund's NAV/unit increased by 0.30% compared to the FBM KLCI's rise of 0.10%.

**DISCLAIMER:**

Based on the fund's portfolio returns as at 15 May 2014, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this fund is 9.5 and is classified as "Moderate". (source: Lipper) "Moderate" includes funds with VF that are above 7.9 but not more than 10.6 (source: Lipper). The VF means there is a possibility for the fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six months. The fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC. The VC referred to was dated 31 December 2013 which is calculated once every six months and is valid until its next calculation date, i.e. 30 June 2014.
