This Fund is suitable for Investors who:

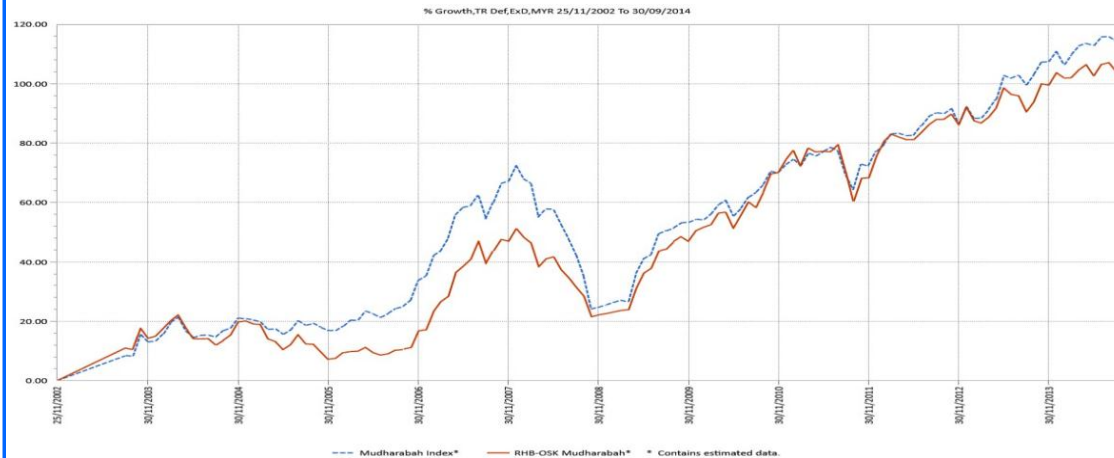
- want an investment that complies with the principles of Shariah;

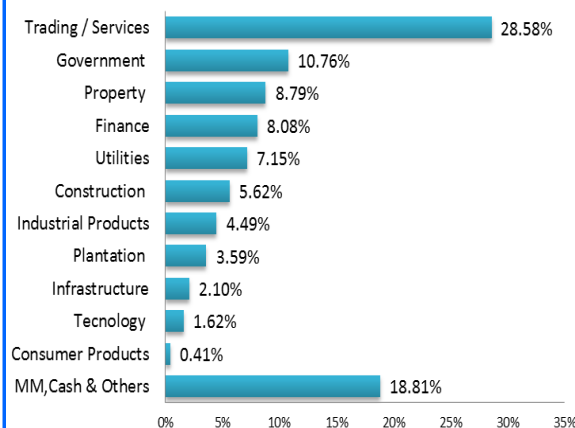

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MANAGER'S COMMENTS
MARKET REVIEW

The FBMKLCI (KLCI) ended the month of September on a bearish tone after falling 1.06% to end at 1,846.31. On a YTD basis the KLCI remains in a weak spot vs. regional peers after easing 1.11% in the last nine months. Smaller cap stocks resumed their outperformance after last month's short breather. The broader market also ended the month lower but managed to outperform the KLCI, with the FBM Emas falling 0.5% mom to 12,925pts. The FBM Small cap index rose 0.3% to 18,666pts while the FBM ACE climbed 0.5% to 7,279pts. Average daily value traded on Bursa in Sep declined 15% mom to RM2.14bn.

The pause in Overnight Policy Rate ("OPR") spurred buying interest on the short-end of the curve. As a result, the local government bond market bullish steepened with short-end yields compressed more than long-end yields. At close, the 3-, 5-, 7-, 10-, 15-, 20- and 30-year MGS were traded at 3.47% (August: 3.50%), 3.67% (3.68%), 3.80% (3.81%), 3.89% (3.91%), 4.21% (4.21%), 4.31% (4.30%) and 4.71% (4.64%) respectively. On the other hand, performance of the Government Investment Issues ("GII") were rather range bound with the 3-, 5-, 7-, 10-, 15-year and 20-year benchmark yields transacted at 3.66% (July: 3.61%), 3.80% (3.79%), 4.00% (4.00%), 4.14% (4.14%), 4.42% (4.39%) and 4.62% (4.61%) respectively

Average daily corporate bond trading volume moderated to RM424mil from RM575mil a month ago on the back of low primary issuances. 56.2% of the trades were in GG/AAA segment, while 43.4% in AA segment.

The rally in government bonds since July has finally spilled over to corporate bonds.

OUTLOOK & STRATEGY

October has historically been a decent month for the stock market, with the KLCI rising an average of 1.4% over the past 25 years. However, we doubt the KLCI will be able to stage a strong rally on the upside in October despite the tabling of Budget 2015 next week as the key concerns on the weak corporate earnings as well as the high household debts in Malaysia remain. We are lowering our support level to 1,830-1,825 for the month of October whilst any upward movement will see the KLCI encountering a strong resistance at the 1,860-1,870 level in October.

BNM kept OPR steady at 3.25% as expected and we continue to believe the interest rate outlook to remain stable for the rest of 2014. This is supported by the wordings in statement such as "absence of external price pressures" and "moderate demand conditions" to mitigate impact of cost factors on underlying inflation. The next milestone to look forward is the Budget 2015 speech where we expect further tweaks on the speed and mechanism of subsidy rationalization, with a targeted approach toward various income groups, likely to be rolled out next year ahead of the GST implementation. Thus, the degree of fiscal tightening next year remains unclear and will need to be determined and the Central Bank's stance next year. We will be watching the budget announcement on 10 October to assess its impact on inflation and private consumption.

On that note, we continue to have a neutral portfolio duration with a moderate bias to longer duration in view of no more rate hikes for the rest of the year.
